Mary's Pence Grants provide funding to organizations in the U.S. and Canada that are working to create long-term systemic change to ensure social, racial, and economic justice for women and their communities. To date, Mary's Pence has awarded nearly \$1.9 million dollars in grants to women-led organizations across the Americas that are amplifying the voices of women in their call for equity and justice.



- Women Led Guided by and for cis women, trans women, non-binary people and their communities.
- Community Centered Developed out of a need identified within the community, and collaboratively managed by members of the community to meet new, changing or emerging needs.
- Sustainable Models of Long-term Change Dedicated to shifting
  public opinion about justice issues; forming alliances and collaborations
  across diverse populations; creating change in unjust structure or policies;
  or building capacity by building leadership, organizing or other social justice
  skills.
- Social Justice Focused Committed to the promotion of human dignity, the common good, the right to economic security and dignified work, care for the earth, participation, subsidiarity (decisions are made at the most local level possible and involve those most impacted) and nonviolence.

Mary's Pence is the most woman-focused funder we have encountered. They address social justice issues with none of the rigidity of other funders in that arena. Their approach is simple, logical and well-organized. They are incredibly accessible and supportive in their interactions with applicants but also in their funding processes.

**ESPERA** partners with grassroots women's organizations in Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and El Salvador working to increase women's economic and emotional well-being. ESPERA, which means "she hopes" in Spanish, and is an acronym for *Economic Systems Providing Equitable Resources for All*.

- Economic Security Collaborate with local organizations to help women increase their financial income through access to community lending pools. Contributing to the household income also helps women secure a more active role in their family and community.
- Business Skills Development Provide training, coaching and accompaniment to help women develop and grow their own businesses and gain access to markets.
- Organizational Strengthening and Support Strengthen the capacity of partners to promote the leadership and empowerment of women as both individuals and as part of a larger group of women.
- Emotional Well-Being Committed to helping women gain access to emotional wellness support that allows them to feel comfortable expressing their feelings, addressing past trauma, and living healthy lives.
