Grants Program

Organization Eligibility

- 1) Women led (cis, trans, nonbinary) board and staff 50% or higher
- 2) Annual organization budget under \$250,000
- 3) Located in the U.S. doing work in the U.S.
- 4) A nonprofit organization or a group working with a fiscal sponsor

Funding Focus

- 1) Women led and focused
- 2) Community centered
- 3) Working to enact long-term sustainable change
- 4) Focused on social justice actions

Women Led and Focused

- Centered on issues women face or on gender justice issues,
- benefitting and primarily led by women (cis, trans, or non-binary people).

Community Centered

- emerging from a need identified within the impacted community, and
- collaboratively developed by and led by members of that community;
- flexible enough to meet new, changing or emerging needs.

Justice vs. Charity

Justice / Social Change

- Addresses the underlying causes of injustice
- Focuses on improving prospects for a group of people
- Looks for long-term solutions
- Provide help aimed at permanent change
- Involves "haves" and "have-nots" working together and sharing power
- Requires working toward changes in social structures
- Examples: Organizing community based self-help projects; voter registration; legislative action; running a cooperative; educating the community

Charity

- Addresses the present symptoms of injustice
- Focuses on individual needs
- Looks for immediate solutions
- Provides a direct service with temporary results
- Involves "haves" sharing with "have-nots"
- Requires no change in social structures
- Helps people survive their present crisis
- Examples: Hospitality houses, food pantries, job placement, GED classes

Process

- Step 1: Submit an Initial Funding Inquiry (IFI) email or online
- **Step 2:** Initial Funding Inquiry Reviews eligibility Spring Cycle: Dec 15th, Fall Cycle: June 15th
- **Step 3:** Submit a Grant Application if invited Spring Cycle: Feb 1st, Fall Cycle: Aug 1st
- **Step 4:** Grant Application Reviews by Grants Committee
- Step 5: Grant Award Notifications declines and awards
- Step 6: Feedback offered to declined applicants

The Application

- General Organization information and eligibility
- Issues Addressed by Organization
 - •This is your opportunity to describe your project and how it fits with Mary's Pence values: women-centered, community-centered, social justice focused, etc.
- Budget
 - Organizational budget
 - Shows additional and expected funding received and expected expenses
 - Project budget
 - Demonstrates concrete actions a project will undertake
